Opportunities Through the ABA—Deadlines Approaching

JUDICIAL INTERN OPPORTUNITIES PROGRAM (JIOP) APPLICATION DEADLINE: JANUARY 7, 2011

Sponsored by the ABA Section of Litigation, the JIOP provides opportunities to students who belong to racial and ethnic groups that are traditionally underrepresented in the profession, as well as students with disabilities, students who are economically disadvantaged and students who identify themselves as lesbian, gay, bisexual or transgendered.

This past year, the JIOP placed 170 law students in judicial internships. These positions are made possible through the generous judicial officers at state, federal and appellate levels. In 2011, Internships are available in the following locations: Phoenix, AZ; Los Angeles, CA; San Francisco, CA; Washington, DC; Miami, FL; Illinois; Philadelphia, PA; Texas; Seattle, WA.

Qualified students who pass through the initial screening interview will receive a judicial interview. Interns will receive an award of \$1,500. Law students need not be an ABA Law Student Division member to apply; however, students accepted into the program will be required to join the ABA (\$25.00) and the Section of Litigation (Free). <u>Tell me more</u>.
