1Ls: Northern District of California Judicial Externships

If you are applying to the Northern District of California for a **s**ummer judicial externship, you may send your application before you receive your first semester grades. Applications should not be sent before December 1 and we have been told by at least one Judge that interviews will not commence before February 1. If you do apply before receiving your grades, then your cover letter should state that you will update your application with your first semester transcript as soon as it is released in early 2013.

3Ls: Presidential Management Fellows Program

The Presidential Management Fellows (PMF) program Class of 2013 application period is open and will close on Monday, November 19, 2012, at 11:59pm Eastern Time. The entire application process, including submission of all necessary documents, must be completed during this time period. The Presidential Management Fellows Program is a prestigious two-year paid program with the Federal Government that includes 160-hours of formal classroom training on leadership, management, policy and other topics, challenging assignments and the potential for accelerated promotions. Fellows are hired by agencies to work on domestic and international issues in public administration, technology, science, criminal justice, health, financial management and many other fields. The application is available in two places: at USAJOBS, simply search "Presidential Management Fellows," or go to the PMF website and select the link found under the Application Process/How to Apply webpage. Note that the application includes an on-line assessment so please give yourself ample time to complete it before the

DO I QUALIFY FOR "DIVERSITY" OPPORTUNITIES?

"Diversity" encompasses more than race and ethnicity. Many diversity programs also seek individuals based on disability, socio-economic disadvantage (e.g. first generation college and/or law school graduate), gender identification, and sexual orientation. Due to underrepresentation of women in the profession, many programs are open to *all* female applicants. Read the application criteria carefully before you disqualify yourself from something for which you may be eligible.

THE 1L SHADOW PROGRAM AT KING HALL

History & Development: Since 2001, Camil Skipper '94 has extended an invitation to incoming students at King Hall to follow her during a day of practice. Impressed by students' experiences with Camil during the fall of 2010, members of the Alumni Relations Committee met with Camil and King Hall administrators for guidance to design and implement a program that replicates this educational "shadow" experience in other practice settings. Under the direction of Camil and Matt Stegman, a successful pilot of the program was completed in the spring of 2011 at the US Attorney's Office in Sacramento. Approximately 30 attorneys have committed to host a 1L this academic year. King Hall's Class of 2015 will have the opportunity to shadow practitioners in San Francisco, Oakland, Sacramento and Davis as they go to court, meet with clients, and conference with counsel.

Purpose: The program's objectives are (1) to provide first year law students a preview of settings for different practices to help them identify their interest, (2) to enhance alumni's relation to King Hall through interactions with members of its most recent classes, and generally (3) to promote the visibility and reputation of King Hall students in diverse legal settings in California.

Fall 2012 : Stay tuned for application information. In January, the Career Services will co-host a professionalism training session for students in the shadow program. After an assignment, students will reach out to the attorneys to schedule their shadow. Students will be provided with specific instructions for their role in the shadow, and attorneys will be provided general information about different types of meaningful experiences for students.
