Public Interest/Public Sector Career Day - February 1, 2014

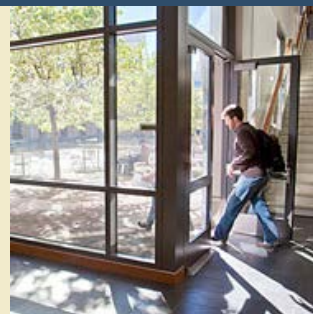

The **Capital Fellows Programs** offer a unique opportunity to participate in policymaking and development. Fellows work for 10-11 months as full-time, paid staff members in the California State Assembly, California State Senate, California Executive Branch or the California Judiciary. Fellows actively engage in public service and prepare for future careers, while gaining firsthand experience in the governance and leadership of the most diverse, complex state in the nation.

Voted three years in a row (2010, 2011 & 2012) as one of the Top 10 internships nationwide by *Vault.com*, the Capital Fellows Programs are ranked highly for their combination of meaningful work experience and career opportunities. Each year, Vault's editors evaluate the internship programs profiled in their annual guide and select from those the top 10 internship programs they feel represent the best all-around opportunities.

Prospective Capital Fellows must have a bachelor's degree (in any major) by September 1, 2014 and a demonstrated interest in California state government and public service. Now we know: we have heard candid, personal stories from some of California's most inspiring women leaders. They have shared with you the experiences and influences that led them to follow their passions, take risks, and build their careers and their families. We believe young woman should benefit from this wisdom. We have seen the powerful and positive impact She Shares has on women coming together to support a common goal: cultivating successful and meaningful professional experiences for the next generation of women.

WHY SHOULD I PARTICIPATE IN THE SHE SHARES MENTORING PROGRAM? Young women starting their careers are faced with a number of challenges from learning how to present themselves on social media, how to interact with professionals at a networking meeting, to preparing resumes and navigating interviews for their first job. The She Shares Mentoring program is designed to help ease the stress and build skills necessary for developing a professional career. Six mentees and mentors will be engaged in a yearlong program designed to enhance their skills, connect with peers and develop a professional relationship with their mentor.

- Engage in four skill building workshops designed specifically for mentees
- Participate in four She Shares conversations with women leaders from across the state

WHAT IS REQUIRED? HOW DO I APPLY? Applicants must be enrolled in a two-or four-year college program, come from the Sacramento/Davis area and be willing to commit to a year-long program. She Shares conversations are held quarterly in the afternoon and training workshops will be held after work hours or on weekends. The program is a full-time (32 hours per week), six-week minimum, summer internship program open to all first- or second-year diverse law students. The deadline for all applications is **January 10, 2014**, but you are encouraged to apply as soon as possible.

The mission of the Judicial Intern Opportunity Program is to provide opportunities to students who are members of racial and ethnic groups that are traditionally underrepresented in the profession.
