ABOUT THE UNIVERSITY OF CALIFORNIA

The University of California (UC) is one of the finest public institutions of higher education in the United States, with many professional schools including five law schools located at its campuses in Berkeley, Davis, Irvine, Los Angeles and San Francisco. The UC Davis University Library contains more than three million volumes, and the Mabie Law Library houses more than 375,000 print volumes and volume equivalents, and provides access to a wealth of licensed online resources as well as electronic access to journals and databases via the California Digital Library.

The UC Davis School of Law is a top-tier U.S. law school. Our students consistently perform well on the California bar examination. All courses offered through the International Law Programs are MCLE-approved by the California and New York Bar Associations. The International Law Section of the State Bar of California is a co-sponsor of these programs.

ABOUT THE CITY OF DAVIS

The UC Davis campus is located in the city of Davis. Davis has a population of approximately 69,000, and is a popular place for professionals and their families because it is safe, comfortable and has a variety of recreational opportunities. Known as an ecologically aware and socially innovative town, Davis has more than 160 kilometers of bicycle paths and boasts the highest percentage of bicycle commuters in the United States. It also has 210 hectares of parks, greenbelts and open spaces.



Davis is located in the Central Valley about 20 kilometers from Sacramento, the state capital, where many of the trade and business policies for California are determined. Davis is within two hours of the San Francisco Bay Area and the world famous Napa Valley. Only two hours from Lake Tahoe, Davis is also within close proximity to some of California's most beautiful and historic areas such as the Sierra Nevada Gold Country, Yosemite Valley and Monterey.

ADVANCED LAW DEGREE

MASTER OF LAWS (LL.M.)

A one- or two-year, in-residence program

August – May each year;

August or January starts available

The UC Davis School of Law LL.M. offers a superior educational experience for foreign lawyers, judges, prosecutors and other legal professionals. Classes are taught by outstanding faculty scholars, and students are integrated into J.D. classes. The program is designed around individual student needs, and LL.M. students can pursue a general course of study or a specialization from an area within the UC Davis School of Law curriculum such as Business Law, private and public International Law, Criminal Law and Procedure, Intellectual Property, Human Rights and Social Justice Law, Public Interest Law, Environmental and Natural Resources Law, Health Law and Bioethics and many others. Students may also take a pre-Bar study program. UC Davis offers one- and two-year options.

LL.M. candidates must complete a minimum of 20 semester units. Foreign LL.M. candidates take two courses especially designed for foreign law graduates that provide a foundation for understanding the U.S. legal system. Participants earn the remainder of their required course credit by taking regular courses at the UC Davis School of Law with American J.D. students.

The law school also admits foreign LL.M. candidates on a thesis rather than a course basis. The thesis track requires a substantial proposed research project falling within the area of expertise of a law faculty member who is willing to supervise the student's research and who strongly recommends graduate study for the applicant. The law school accepts thesis-track students only if their proposed thesis is likely to make a significant scholarly contribution.

LL.M. candidates must complete their degree during two consecutive semesters of residential study for the one-year program; please inquire about our two-year LL.M. options. LL.M. candidates are encouraged to enroll in ***Orientation in U.S.A. Law***, offered immediately before the Master of Laws (LL.M.) program begins.

To ensure a top quality experience for its students, the Master of Laws (LL.M.) program is selective. Applicants must have a minimum TOEFL iBT score of 88 (or 230 computer-based or 570 paper-based score). An IELTS score of 6.5 is also acceptable.

ORIENTATION IN U.S.A. LAW

July 11 – July 29, 2022

PROGRAM AUDIENCE AND CONTENT

For more than 30 years, the Orientation in U.S.A. Law program has served lawyers, judges, prosecutors and defenders, notaries, law professors, pre-LL.M. students and business professionals who wish to gain a better understanding of the theories and practices of the U.S. legal system. The program combines classes, interactive activities (such as moot court), field trips and social events.

PROGRAM TOPICS

- U.S. legal system (including the court system, the case law system, the legislative process)
- U.S. constitutional law (including Separation of Powers, Federalism and Bill of Rights)
- Torts (civil liability)
- Contracts
- Criminal law and criminal procedure
- Civil procedure
- Property
- Business associations and corporate law
- Evidence
- Legal research
- Moot court/trial demonstration (simulation of court argument)

ADDITIONAL TOPICS INCLUDE

- Intellectual property
- Environmental law
- Taxation
- Securities regulation
- Law and technology
- Other timely topics

This program also includes on-site visits and observations (subject to public health guidance) and social events that will help you connect with other students and build an international network.

INSTRUCTORS

This program draws law school faculty from the University of California, Davis, as well as outstanding legal practitioners and experts (such as judges, attorneys, etc.)

WHERE

The School of Law plans to offer the Orientation Program on-site at the University of California, Davis. Students who are unable to join on-site will also have the option to attend classes online in real time (simultaneously) or by recordings.

Most on-site/real time classes will be offered in the morning (9 AM to 12 PM PST). Students wishing to attend the program online will receive additional academic support every week. University of California, Davis, School of Law

ENGLISH FOR LEGAL PROFESSIONALS

June 27 – July 8, 2022

Since 1992, this intensive program has provided an ideal introduction to and review of English and legal analysis as used by legal professionals in the United States. Interactive and supporting, English for Legal Professionals provides excellent preparation for legal professionals, or law students who want to improve their legal English and legal analysis or who are preparing to enroll in an LL.M. program.

PROGRAM TOPICS*

English for Legal Professionals consists of approximately 30 hours of activities (20 hours of online instruction plus 10 hours of outside practice) that will challenge you to improve your skills.

- Develop reading, writing and legal analysis skills for professional and academic settings
- Learn and practice legal vocabulary and grammar
- Contracts
- Practice reading and briefing legal cases
- Analyze case hypotheticals and solve legal problems
- Write a legal memo, client letter and legal message exam
- Present legal oral arguments
- Create a group project
- Engage in group work with other participants from around the world

PRE-LAW PROGRAM: ACADEMIC SKILLS AND LEGAL SYSTEM OVERVIEW FOR STUDYING U.S. LAW

August 1 – August 12, 2022

The UC Davis School of Law is offering a two-week Pre-Law Academic Program for prospective and incoming LL.M. and international J.D. students as well as legal practitioners who are interested in learning how to succeed in a US legal education environment. The program provides some introductory material on the fundamentals of the US legal system and will teach you how to succeed in your LL.M. or J.D. program. In addition, the program provides panels with former students and professors who give tips and insights to support you in your academic success.

PROGRAM TOPICS

All participants are introduced to:

- The case law method
- Class structure and expectations
- Socratic method
- Case briefing
- Studying methods such as note taking and outlining
- Test taking skills: essay and multiple choice

CERTIFICATES, APPLICATION PERIOD & VISA INFORMATION

All participants will receive a certificate of completion if they attend class regularly.

DEADLINE TO APPLY

We strongly recommend enrolling by June 15 or earlier to ensure adequate time for the local U.S. embassy in your country to process the necessary visa for entering the U.S. We have been informed by past participants that U.S. embassies in some countries can take from four to six weeks to process non-immigrant visas (students, business or tourist).


